"Too Hot To Handel" Returns to the Detroit Opera House for 18th Annual Performance

Holiday Tradition Features Jazz-Gospel Version of Handel's "Messiah"

Dec. 14 at the Detroit Opera House

DETROIT, Dec. 4, 2019 - Rackham Choir and the Detroit Opera House are proud to return to the Detroit Opera House stage Saturday, Dec. 14 for the 18th annual performance of "Too Hot To Handel". Hailed as the holiday celebration that is "too hot to miss," this jazz-gospel version of Handel's classic "Messiah" has become a tradition for the Motor City, combining decidedly Detroit-inspired styles such as jazz and gospel while weaving in blues, swing, classical and scat. The Opera House pulses with music and the true spirit of the holidays as more than 120 musicians fill the stage and share a soul-stirring experience with the audience!

"Too Hot to Handel' is a beloved Detroit tradition rooted in the music and soul the city is known for," said Rackham Choir Artistic Director Suzanne Mallare Acton. "It's a great experience for the whole family and a great way to get into the holiday spirit."

"Too Hot" is conducted by Acton and features Rackham Choir, tenor Rodrick Dixon, soprano Alfreda Burke and alto Karen Marie Richardson. They are joined by the Too Hot Trio, Marion Hayden, Alvin Waddles and Dave Taylor, as well as a full roster of some of Detroit's best jazz musicians including Chris Collins, Al Ayoub, Fred Hughes, James Simonson, Vincent Chandler, Rick Wolkins and James Hughes. Members of the Michigan Opera Theatre Orchestra complete the "Too Hot Orchestra."

Acton and select performers will be giving a special pre-show talk at the Detroit Opera House beginning at 6:30 p.m., one hour before the performance.
